ABOUT THE ACADEMY

AFRICA

The Africa Arbitration Academy is an initiative of the foremost young arbitration practitioners' group in Africa – the Association of Young Arbitrators (AYA). The Academy was established due to the rising demand for improved expertise and training of arbitration practitioners in Africa, and to expose the young practitioners to the current trends and developments in international commercial and investment arbitration. The inaugural Academy program holds in London (June 2019) and taught by international arbitration experts (academics and practitioners), heads of arbitration institutions, in-house counsel, and judges. The overall objective of the Academy is to provide the much-needed specialized training to young arbitration practitioners from Africa and to equip them with the right set of skills to succeed within the international arbitration community.

The three-week advanced courses are offered in different formats including lectures, workshops and seminars. There will also be mentoring sessions where renowned arbitration experts take time to share career tips and life experiences with participants. Participants are involved in team building exercises, networking events in law firms, and mock arbitration competition. Through the lectures, networking receptions, and workshops, participants expand their perspectives on international arbitration and are enriched with better professional skills and knowledge.

Participants who successfully complete the three-week program move into the alumni of the Academy, and it is hoped that through the alumni, a new generation of arbitration practitioners with the requisite expertise to succeed in international arbitration, will emerge. The Academy will also in coming years help Africans who are desirous of pursuing graduate or post graduate degree programmes in international arbitration to review their application materials and guide them through the process.







